Welcome back! I know it is somewhat cliché but doesn't the summer just speed by! We are looking forward to a great school year with returning and new staff! Joining Cumberland will be Michelle Zierten as Explorer Coordinator and high school Social Studies teacher; Brooke Swearingen as Physical Education and High school Math and Career Prep teacher; Melissa Cammack as High School and Middle School Spanish teacher and teacher assistant, and Anna Scheidt as Pioneer teacher assistant and school counselor.

Cumberland has adopted a new grade 4-12 Math program by Pearson Publishing which more closely aligns with the Georgia Standards of Excellence. We have discontinued GRADE and GMADE assessment testing in favor of MAP (Measures of Academic Progress) testing which will be computer administered and give almost immediate results. We have also discontinued IXL in favor of the Study Island remedial and practice program which aligns nicely with the MAP testing. All of these changes will better enable us to serve our students.

We also welcome many new students and families to the Cumberland community! Please make them feel at home as you meet them. Here's hoping for a productive and rewarding school year!

Counselor's Corner



Your Cumberland Counselors hope you and your family had a fun and relaxing summer break! It is our hope that this school year will be full of successful experiences for all our students. The term "back to school" inspires both joy and anxiety. Because transition from vacation to school can be challenging, we will share a few suggestions to help reduce anxiety for the new school year.


- Establish the school routine a week or two before school starts. Will bedtime be earlier? Will TV/Video time and bath/shower times be different? Regular routines make life more predictable for your child.
- The basics are important anxious children and teens often forget to eat, don't feel hungry and don't get enough sleep. Stick to routines in the morning and bedtime and provide nutritious snacks for your students.
- Encourage your child to share his or her fears. Some students feel most comfortable sharing at bedtime or during mealtime. Teens often share more when in the car or taking a walk. Focus on problem solving "If the worst happens, what could you do? " Or "Let's think of some ways you could handle that situation."

This year we welcome Ms. Anna Scheidt to the counseling staff as Pioneer Counselor Coordinator. Anna is a familiar face as she worked as a Cumberland Counselor Intern last year. We look forward to Ms. Belinda returning for her 7th year at Cumberland. Ms. Belinda has experienced much success working with students to reduce anxiety through color therapy and progressive relaxation. We look forward to Ms. Yvon Roland returning as Navigator Counselor Coordinator and Ms. Val working with the Explorers and as Director of Counseling Services. We are excited to have Dr. Kelli Ritter return for her 7th year advising at Cumberland. We welcome Ms. Carla Carter and Ms. Christy Muffley as Counselor Interns for the 2016-2017 school year. In addition to individual counseling, the Cumberland Counseling Team will be connecting with your students less formally during arrival/dismissal, lunch/recess, and in their enrichment classes. We will continue monthly counseling themes starting in September with Strengths.

Technology



We're very excited about our instructional technology program here at Cumberland. We are currently renewing our status as a Common Sense Media Digital Certified School. We are also increasing our number of Digital Citizenship Certified Educators from three to seven, including two of our full-time counselors. We believe very strongly that our students benefit from explicit instruction in online etiquette, privacy, and copyright. Before the students are allowed to use Chromebooks at school, they will complete three hours of instruction on these topics. We will also be sending home "Family Tip Sheets" you can use as a resource to have your own discussions at home. Please look for them in Thursday Folders each month.

Cumberland uses Chromebooks as our assistive technology solution. Chromebooks are currently the number one best-selling educational device, outselling both iPads and traditional laptops. Chromebooks are ideal for students with special needs. Online files mean no more missing assignments lost in backpacks. Students can set the text to be more readable by changing fonts and contrasts. Spell checkers and voice typing reduce anxiety about writing assignments. Also, Google tools are explicitly designed for collaboration, giving our students more opportunities to work together on projects and practice social skills.
